Dra. Monique Megens

Monique has a passion for companion animal health and welfare. She dedicates much of her time to help raise awareness, to liaise between stakeholders and to help ensure companion animal health and welfare is high on the international agenda.

Graduated from Utrecht University The Netherlands (1998), Monique started her career as a companion animal veterinary practitioner. In 2008 she sold her clinic to work as an independent project manager and consultant.

Monique has been involved in veterinary politics in Europe for many years, serving amongst others as the President of the Federation of European Companion Animal Veterinary Associations (FECAVA). On behalf of FECAVA, she was a member of the joint Union of European Veterinary Practitioners (UEVP) & Federation of Veterinarians of Europe (FVE) Animal Welfare Working Group. She was responsible for the European veterinary position paper on stray dogs, the position paper on (il)legal dog trade and the position paper on the responsible breeding of dogs. Monique has been a speaker on these topics at many International conferences.

Currently, she is a member of the World Small Animal Veterinary Association (WSAVA) Hereditary Disease Committee, a consultant to the Dutch Kennel Club, the chair of the International Collaborative on Extreme Conformation in Dogs and a consultant to the International Partnership for Dogs (IPFD).

In 2019 Monique moved to Spain, where she enjoys the weather and the beautiful countryside!



Prof. Gilles Dupré

Gilles Dupré graduated in France and did his surgical training both in France and in the USA where he was resident in small animal surgery. He spent then 17 years in Paris as co-head and surgeon of a large referral practice, Fregis hospital, in Paris. In 2005, he was appointed by the veterinary medicine University of Vienna as Professor for small animal surgery and Head of the clinic for small animal surgery, ophthalmology, dentistry, physical therapy and rehabilitation. Since October 2020, Gilles Dupré is director of education at the European School for Advanced Veterinary Studies (ESAVS).

Gilles Dupré is Diplomate of the European college of Veterinary Surgeons and Diplomate of human interventional pneumology and thoracoscopic surgery.

Professor Dupré has published hundreds of articles in peer-reviewed journals, supervised many thesis and dissertations and written many surgery book chapters. Overall, he is a passionate teacher and advocate of atraumatic surgery as a key to success.



Dra. Inês Freitas

Médica Veterinária, formada na Universidade de Évora em 2016. Experiência profissional em clínica de animais de companhia desde então, tendo passado pelo Hospital Veterinário do Porto, Hospital Veterinário da Universidade Lusófona e actualmente na CVMI em Carcavelos. As suas áreas de interesse são a cardiologia, reprodução, medicina pediátrica e cirurgia.

Esteve sempre ligada à canicultura e em particular aos braquicéfalos, nomeadamente como delegada de saúde do Boxer Clube de Portugal, até 2020. Ingressou recentemente no BOAS Project, pelo CPC, em colaboração com a Universidade de Cambridge e o Kennel Club inglês, que tem como objectivo classificar os braquicéfalos com uma prova funcional, podendo, a partir daí, acrescentar outras doenças a rastrear na raça.
